

THE LOST CITY OF UBAR, **OMAN**

I recently had the pleasure of attending a lecture in Exeter by Sir Ranulph Fiennes, British Explorer and finder of Oman's fabled 'Lost city of Ubar' celebrated as the centre of the lucrative frankincense trade some 3,000 years before Christ. The fortress city had been buried under the shifting sands of a section

Rub'al Khali or Empty Quarter. Frankincense, an aromatic resin grown in the nearby **Qara Mountains** was used in cremations, perfumes and medicines and at one time was as valuable as gold.

FIONA'S TRIP REPORT: JANUARY 2024



Jamtara-

INDIAN WILDERNESS AT ITS BEST

I'm sitting on the decking outside my enormous canvas safari tent - which nestles among nine others overlooking a winding dry river bed or *nullah*. All around me tree frogs and cicadas create a perfect symphony interspersed with the occasional alarm call of a langur and chirruping of birds.

I am at the extraordinary wilderness camp of Jamtara, situated on the Northern edge of Pench National Park, some 3hrs drive from Nagpur in Central India's Madhya Pradesh. It's a 1hr 20 flight from Delhi plus the drive - and my oh-my is it worth it! Quite apart from the abundant wildlife, the camp is all about unique experiences. No two meals were eaten in the same place - be it dinner round a fire pit in a remote area of the forest, lunch under a 150 year old giant banyan tree rooted in a dry river bed or a delicious breakfast of eggs, parathas and seed cake washed down with steaming hot coffee served during our morning game drive.

Jamtara's owner, Amit Sankala, is a true visionary with a family pedigree stretching back several generations in tiger conservation and owning/running these unique camps - and my goodness it shows. The location is sublime, the staff could not have been kinder and the naturalists were full of knowledge, enthusiasm and dedication to showcasing the best of India's natural wonders.

Game drives are morning and evening in nifty gypsy jeeps exclusive for each family. Open topped with tiered seating, they are perfect for exploring the park via its numerous sandy tracks through teak and sal forest, grassland and ethereal water holes.

Back to my planter's chair on the verandah, I'm completely absorbed in the moment as I think back to our first thrilling morning in the park. Peering back at us through a dense thicket of bamboo - we're held spellbound under a constant steady orange and black gaze it's a heart stopping moment for our sons who have just spotted their first Royal Bengal Tiger in the wild. We've only been in the National Park for half an hour and cannot quite believe it. A mother and cubs are resting up on a kill and we are lucky enough to catch a glimpse of this iconic mammal. Shortly after we encounter wild dog (two on the track in front of us) and three shy jackals darting this way and that. The solid black form of a lone wild boar scuttles through the scrub, majestic herds of chital (spotted deer) graze under the trees and we have several great sightings of gaur and sambhar. There's plenty of interest for birders too with birds of prey, ducks on the water, owls and more - not forgetting the emblematic peacocks which seem to be round every corner.

Jamtara is a must for any serious wildlife enthusiast and combines very well with Bandhavgarh and Kanha National Parks which are both within a half day drive.

SHH - MOROCCO'S HIDDEN DESERT GEM

JAMTARA STAR BED

For generations, Indian villagers have spent their nights in the fields on machans (beds on raised platforms), to keep a watchful eye on their livestock. Jamtara Lodge close to Pench National Park in Central India allows guests a similar (albeit more comfortable) experience with its very own Star Bed. Under the night sky, you'll listen to an orchestra of crickets, owls, frogs and jackals ceremoniously punctuated by the alarm calls of the spotted deer. It is wilderness in its purest form. Ask for details.

OLD PATAGONIA

Thinking of travelling to Argentina? Heading South to Antarctica? Explore one of the quietest corners of the world - 10 room Nibepo Aike the only livestock ranch within Los Glaciares National Park. See gauchos on horseback herding cattle and sheep, ride out to hidden glaciers with a picnic or trek/sail to the Perito Moreno Glacier. Journey on foot (a trek of 3 days /2 nights) through the Patagonian

immensity, surrounded by the wild beauty of the Sierra Baguales Mountains. Nibepo Aike preserves the essence of the old Patagonian estancias. Today, after three generations, the ranch is still run by the same family.

Getting there: 56kms or 1.5 hours' drive from **El Calafate** in **Southern Argentina**

NEW YEAR IN CAMBODIA

Less visited than its neighbours, Cambodia is a South East Asian jewel. Stunning natural scenery, beautiful temples, empty beaches and a fading colonial French grandeur make it a truly compelling destination. Since the 13th century, New Year in Cambodia has been set according to the solar calendar and usually falls in mid-April, just after crops have been harvested. The whole city of Siem Reap bursts into a wildly colourful celebration, with most of the buildings adorned with displays of stars, flowers and fruit. There are traditional dance performances, processions, live music, fireworks, feasting and a huge, citywide water fight.

All this takes place, of course, against the backdrop of the world-renowned **Angkor Wat** temples.

SMALL PLANE CHARTER IN SRI LANKA

If you are short on time but keen to see **Sri Lanka's** main sights, consider the option of domestic air travel. There are a variety of great routes which link the capital **Colombo** with **Kandy** and the Cultural Triangle, and the hills, **Jaffna** and the coast. Flights aren't always flexible - you can't fly from the south coast to the Cultural Triangle or **Kandy** without changing in **Colombo**, but do ask about chartering your own plane. Helicopter charters are also possible.

I'LL TAKE THE HIGH ROAD TO USHGULI

I'm still musing over my trip to Georgia last autumn and thinking of what I left to do next time. If you, like me, yearn for haunting vistas, read on. Travelling in Autumn, due to snow I had to miss out this 4WD-only high route from Tsageri to Ushguli in Georgia's Northwest high Caucasus region of Svaneti. The wending 92km journey offers astounding views of mountain peaks, luscious valleys, and the remains of glaciers. The road to the town is snow-covered for 6 months of the year and tops out at the 2620m Zagari Pass.

TRIP REPORT: **FIONA'S ANTARCTIC EXPRESS**



The cry went out 'orcas on the port side' and moments later three of these awesome ocean predators were powering alongside our ship. Memorable! I'm aboard top notch 132 passenger **Sylvia Earle** on her 9-day **Antarctic** Peninsula Express - a concise sail-fly voyage from Ushuaia to the Antarctic Peninsula. This is the voyage for those with limited time but wanting to see the mesmerizing 7th continent.

The infamous **Drake Passage** - a two-day sail was extremely kind to us and combined with the stability of the ship and her special X-Bow, the dining room was full most days. We travelled at 16 knots to run ahead of a brewing storm and arrived at Melchior Island ahead of time, giving space to a pod of feeding whales. Gliding by huge blue/ white icebergs with incredible striations, we entered a sheltered bay and headed out by zodiac to explore hidden coves.

Further zodiac cruises in the coming days encountered light snow, limp sunshine and impressively large-scale icebergs. In Paradise Bay, a colony of cormorants rested on bird cliffs and gentoos bustled in their rookeries outside the Argentine Brown Base. We made a continental landing at Portal Point and hiked up through deep snow to incredible view-points over

sparkling Charlotte Bay. The two landings per day were always in varied locations and full of surprise. The polar snorkellers swam with fur seals. Kayakers and hikers spotted a mound of elephant seals. We had soaring skuas and a thrilling encounter with feeding humpback whales blowing and diving all about our zodiac. We walked on rocky shores littered with whale bones, hiked volcanic sand in the flooded caldera of **Deception Island** and spotted a lone king penguin in the South Shetland Islands. What a thrill!

Flying out to Chile from the gravel air strip on King George Island - time to reflect. Truly a trip to remember!

The northern tip of **Musandam** was the real highlight for us.
