BAWA'S SRI LANKA

Exciting news is the opening of Lunuganga, the former home of Sri Lanka's celebrated architect Geoffrey Bawa now a small luxury hotel set among 15 acres of extensive gardens that edge Dedduwa Lake in Bentota (10 mins from the southwest coast). To stay in such hallowed grounds is a treat for anyone with a passion for design. Rooms in the main 1930s plantation house open onto lawns peppered with frangipani flowers. The most recent addition is the former threebedroom home of Ena de Silva, a renowned batik artist, dismantled, moved from Colombo and reassembled piece by piece in Bawa's garden. Local experiences include cookery demos, southern art tours and trips to Brief, the smaller yet equally captivating former home and estate of Bevis Bawa, Geoffrey's older brother.

Dear Adventurer

As I write, I am preparing for an extensive trip to Georgia in early October. See inside for details of my Seminar at Sea earlier this year on board a French luxury icebreaker, and our fantastic recce in the Maldives in July. As summer draws to a close, it's time to start to plan your winter escape so do get in touch. We've got great feedback from this summer's travellers, interesting ideas for winter warmers and some unique suggestions for polar adventures in 2024.

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"Mum, it's insane!" So exclaimed my 18 year old as our small boat chugs up to the jetty - turquoise waters, swaying palms and a beautiful curve of decking over white sandy beach. We've come to recce the other-worldly island of **Makunudu** in the **Maldives** and in truth we've already all fallen in love with this little slice of heaven.

This is the Maldives as it used to be. I first came here 30 years ago and whilst in that time a huge raft of swanky resorts have sprung up, all jostling for rankings, with pools, over-water bungalows, and more restaurants than you could shake a stick at, Makunudu has simply gone on with what it does best - barefoot, Robinson Crusoe, living - making your stay all about its natural beauty not about the facilities. Don't think, though, that you won't be comfortable. 36 pretty thatched cottages with AC, ceiling fans and open air bathrooms all face out over the azure waters. Each has a shady sit out and beach lounger. The central bar was one of our favourite haunts, be it in the heat of the day under the high ceilinged thatched roof or during long evenings on the deck over the water, spotting nurse and reef sharks gliding by while sipping a cold beer or tropical cocktail. The food - another highlight - was an imaginative blend of Maldivian, Indian, Sri Lankan and Western Cuisine - delicious buffets and a la carte dining with ever attentive staff who take the trouble to get to know you personally.

Daily we headed out to snorkel on the house reef rainbow coloured Parrot and Picasso fish, royal blue giant clams, translucent needle fish, shoals of Moorish Idols, brilliantly named Humbugs and striped Oriental Sweetlips, tiny darters, a Moray Eel and the crowning glory, Hawksbill Turtles which we watched bottom feeding and rising to the surface on numerous occasions.

We kayaked around the island and took a paddle board one afternoon to an outer reef to snorkel among black tipped reef sharks. Here I saw three pygmy rays swimming in perfect formation. After trying the resort dive, the boys were hooked and went on to do their PADI Diving Course. With a private instructor just for the two of them, and in the most sublime conditions, where better to take on a sport which unlocks the door to a whole new world of discovery.

Whilst I grant that this island is not for those looking for top luxury, it WAS for us. And for our boys – a first holiday for them in such a tropical location – an absolute winner. It's quite something to impress an 18 and 20 year old, not to mention my husband who has, over the years, travelled all around the globe.






We met two couples who had honeymooned at **Makunudu** almost 30 years ago and were thrilled to return and find it barely changed. This place is a tonic for the soul and for sure I'm not leaving it another 30 years before I come back.

WHEN TO GO

We travelled off (rainy) season - in July - but in truth had 29-31^C daily and precisely three minutes of rain the whole week. Global warming has made the **Maldives** a much more year round destination. Though November to April should mean better weather, travel in low season and you'll take advantage of lower rates and a more chilled vibe. Many times when snorkelling I'd be the only one on the reef.



Icebreaker WHICH BREAKS THE MOULD

I'm still pinching myself. After an unforgettable three days spent crossing the channel aboard the luxurious French ice breaker **Le Commandant Charcot**, I don't know where to start with the superlatives. The company was created over 35 years ago by **French** sailors. Today they deliver a polished expedition performance without stinting on the comfort and elegance you might expect from a chic **European** operator.



Le Commandant Charcot is the world's first hybrid icebreaker. She carries 200 guests in polar regions and luxury is her byword. Think all-balcony cabins, a superb 180 degree glass observation lounge, science lab with resident scientists, restaurant with floor to ceiling windows, walk round deck, indoor pool, spa, sauna, ice room and outdoor hot tub.

Whilst the ship's elegant décor and numerous clever touches lend an air of luxury and comfort to the rugged destinations she visits, the emphasis on board is on reaching locations other ships cannot reach, and giving guests an experience like no other.

She offers some incredible voyages with a difference, but my signature trip has to be **Snow Hill Island** in the **Weddell Sea**.



No other ship has the capability of cutting through the thick fast ice and reaching within 2-3 kms of the most northerly Emperor Penguin colony in **Antarctica**. While others may well have to helicopter in, with Charcot you are able to park up against land and it's a short walk from there.

Hybrid power capabilities allow her to operate silently under battery power when approaching mammals and whales. The advanced ice sonar and hull structure allow her to seemingly float on the ice so you have none of the juddering and shaking of the old Russian ice breakers. For the trip of a lifetime seriously consider one of these:

Sailing 3 - 17 November 2023 the Emperor Penguins of the Weddell Sea is an expedition into the wildest corners of Antarctica, where emperor penguins, leopard seals, and humpback whales are among the wildlife you'll see. From the Drake Passage, venture south to the frostbitten waters of the Weddell Sea, a landscape dominated by ice floes, gigantic tabular icebergs, and colonies of Adelie penguins to kayak, hike and snowshoe in this majestic environment.

Price from £30,600 per person. Voyage only.

In February 2023, **Le Commandant Charcot** completed her first **Antarctic Semi-Navigation**. The 28-day voyage covered 6,500 nautical miles, venturing as far as **Pine Island Bay**, at the southeastern end of the **Amundsen Sea**, where no cruise ship has ever gone. There, guests got a view of the earth's largest iceberg, the B22, which is about four times the size of **New York City**.

In 2024, join one of two half circumnavigations. The first, taking place from 7 January - 5 February will link the southern tip of America to New Zealand, Ushuaia to Lyttelton, sailing to some of the world's most remote islands (Charcot Island, Peter I Island, and the Marie Byrd Land Islands) and crossing three southern seas.

Price from £36,640 per person. Just add flights.

The second, from 6 February - 3 March 2024 takes inspiration from the Heroic Age expeditions of Jules Dumont d'Urville and Douglas Mawson, crossing five southern seas and attempting to reach the Magnetic South Pole.

This is justifiably **India**'s best known region. The sights here are unsurpassed and so are its **Heritage Hotels** – a unique collection of ancient forts and royal palaces now restored to their former glory whilst retaining much of their original charm and atmosphere.
