

All the guide prices quoted here include international flights from London in economy class, internal transport, transfers to the embarkation point where it is possible to pre-book and accommodation based in twin rooms with meals as specified. Guide prices for voyages are based on twin cabins with shared or private facilities and we can provide prices for single occupancy, triple, quadruple and superior cabins and suites (where available) on request. Trips are fully-guided either from the UK or locally. We also include fuel surcharges known at the time of going to print. 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

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Dog-sledging in mainland Norway

Explore Dividalen – drive your own dogs | 6 days

Everyone agrees on how exhilarating it is to explore by dog sledge, standing on the runners whilst the dogs take the strain. Snow and weather conditions permitting, you will make daily trips through a beautiful snowscape. After a day on the trail relax around a log fire. Your hosts have a fund of stories about life in the north. They are excellent cooks and their menus feature locally caught reindeer, elk and salmon. There's usually the chance to enjoy a sauna or hot tub before you fly home.

Mountain dog sledging hut to hut | 8 days

Combine extensive exploration of **Dividalen's** dramatic scenery of mountains, lakes and high plateaux with the luxury of spending each night in a different mountain hut. Our route will depend on the weather and snow conditions but in the evenings we shall relax in comfort over meals made with local produce, discussing the day's journey.

Northern Lights long weekend | 4 days

Winter in Northern Norway brings the opportunity of witnessing the extraordinary Northern Lights (*Aurora Borealis*) dancing in the sky. The phenomenon is caused by electrical particles from the sun which can suddenly appear and disappear again just as swiftly. We recommend our tailor-made weekends for private groups of four or more. You'll fly to Bardufoss in Arctic Norway and we will take you to your simple cosy accommodation for three nights. Try your hand at dog sledging or cross-country skiing, take a sauna or enjoy a hot tub under starry skies. We can see the *Aurora Borealis* around half of all clear weather nights during the winter, so your chances increase with the length of your stay.

ARCTIC NORWAY AND

Early spring, when the days are rapidly lengthening, is a beautiful time of year in the Arctic and travelling by dog-sledge is to experience its true spirit. These expeditions in the mountains and high plateaux of Northern Norway have been organised and led by our Norwegian friends for many years. We can arrange short trips and extensions such as a visit by skidoo to the Sami (Lapp) people in their summer or winter camps, to Summer Island or the picturesque Lofoten Islands or a day visit to Tromsø and its Polar Museum and Northern Lights Planetarium. For all trips you will drive your own dog team.

The Kings Way: Crossing Norway into Sweden | 8 days

This dog-sledging expedition takes us along the King's Way from the dramatic high peaks and rock faces of Norway to the vast open plateaux and lakes of Sweden. There will be opportunities for dog-sledging along frozen rivers and lakes and exploration of the varied countryside around Kiruna. The expedition ends near Jukkasjarvi where the famous Ice Hotel is located. Made using ice from the Torne River, it is the largest igloo in the world and features ice sculptures, a cinema and the Absolut Ice Bar carved entirely from ice. We can organise a night or two in the hotel for those who want to experience this unique accommodation.

Why not let us tailor-make a **private dogsledging experience** exclusively for you and your family or a small group of friends? Expeditions can be in summer or winter, from three hours to a journey of up to three weeks.

In Northern Norway, you'll be guests of our old friends who work their dog team out of a comfortable cabin at Øverbygd at latitude 69N.
Enjoy convivial, cosy evenings, perhaps with a delicious reindeer stew round the fire, or a glass of wine under the stars in the hot tub.

For the more adventurous we can plan a mountain route from hut to hut along remote trails. From mid-September to mid-April you may be lucky enough to see the Northern Lights dancing in the sky.

BEST TIME TO GO: January to early April for good snow conditions for sledging.

TOP TIP: We provide superbly warm sledging suits and thick felt-lined boots so you will never be cold.

DON'T MISS: The polar museum in Tromsø – it has wonderful atmosphere.

WHAT TO EXPECT: Stunning displays of the *Aurora Borealis* in the night-time sky in the depths of winter (if you're lucky)!

Dog-sledging in Spitsbergen

Winter dog sledge to basecamp ship in the ice | 6 days

Travelling in the footprints of Fritjof Nansen, you'll head out from Longyearbyen in Spitsbergen to beautiful Tempelfjorden, mushing your own dog team of Alaskan huskies to your base for two nights — a well-appointed ship frozen into the pack ice. The boat has 10 comfortable two-bed cabins, and there are good on-board facilities. Enjoy delicious meals and return home with the knowledge of the special relationship between a man and his dog in the Arctic.

Arctic luxury – Isfjord Radio | 6 days

Join a snowmobile expedition to beautiful Isfjord Radio at Cape Linnè. This remote and unique boutique hotel, situated about 90 km west of Longyearbyen provides quality and comfort unexpected in the wilderness. You'll ride over glaciers, mountains and frozen fjords, and visit thrilling historical sites. There's a stillness and a light that is difficult to find elsewhere, and, if you are lucky, you might even glimpse a polar bear.

Footprints from Nordenskiöld | 8 days

This is for those wanting a long dog sledging expedition into the true Arctic land, but not to sleep in a tent! We head north from Longyearbyen to Tempelfjorden and to the unique Basecamp ship in the ice. Spend the night on the 100 year-old schooner before continuing north towards Nordenskiöld Glacier for two nights at Basecamp Nordenskiöld. From there you'll make dog sledging forays over sharp mountains, shiny glaciers and frozen fjords before returning to Longyearbyen.

East to West skiing | 12 days

This superb skiing experience starts out with a snowmobile journey to the east coast . The starting point of the trip will be the **Bay of Agardh**. From here the group will aim to ski 20km each day and set up camp each night. It's a true expedition — you'll join in practical camp tasks such as melting water, making food and digging lavatories. After six days we hope to meet our goal — the last outpost to the west — **Isfjord Radio** where a comfortable bed awaits before the return to **Longyearbyen**.

Adventure week at Nordenskiöld Lodge | 7 days

This trip casts you far from Longyearbyen, right into the heart of the Arctic, to Basecamp Nordenskiöld. Accessed by boat, it's a true expedition lodge in front of the magnificent Nordenskiöld Glacier offering modern comforts without running water or electricity. We use wood to heat up the cabin and fetch our drinking water from the melting glacier. There are five bedrooms, an indoor toilet and a traditional sauna. The adventure week will include several full day trips, planned daily according to the weather.

SVALBARD ARCHIPELAGO (SPITSBERGEN)

Thrilling options for adventures in Spitsbergen

If you would prefer a **private** dog sledging adventure with a local family to an organised group tour, our partners in **Spitsbergen** run their family-owned business from **Bolterdalen**, a valley 10km from the main town of **Longyearbyen**. They have many years of combined experience derived from the Elite Military Sled Patrol (Sirius, Greenland and Svalbard).

The **dog team** is made up of Greenland dogs thought to be directly descended from huskies brought there by the first Inuit settlers. It is a lively, healthy pack comprising some 100 dogs, with 10 to 15 puppies being born each year – a joy both for their families and our visitors.

The **sledding** is superb, with varied valleys and the **High Arctic** offering perfect conditions for the dogs to show off what they can do.

Magic of the Arctic – Summer Spitsbergen | 6 days

Join us on our summer adventure to Basecamp Isfjord Radio at Cape Linnè. After two nights in Longyearbyen we head out to Isfjord by boat. On our way we will have time to enjoy the fantastic fjord, the bird cliffs and the animal wildlife. Far away from civilization you'll discover the history, biological diversity and geological conditions which make this a fascinating place to visit. The former radio station is situated at the outermost part of the Isfjord with majestic mountains overlooking the Arctic Ocean – unique accommodation of unexpected quality and comfort so deep into the wilderness.

ICELAND, GREENLAND AND THE FAROES

ICELAND in summer is a land of midnight sun, whilst in winter you may be lucky enough to witness the *Aurora Borealis* in all its glory. It beckons the visitor with a network of hauntingly scenic routes and natural history sites well-marked and close to the road. We highly recommend self-drive itineraries by car or four-wheel drive or, for the more cautious, we have various chauffeur-driven options to suggest.

Drive around Iceland | 8 days

This tailor-made self-drive package will take you all around Iceland. Highlights of this magnificent tour include the geyser area, dramatic waterfalls at Skógafoss, Seljalandsfoss, Gullfoss and Goðafoss, Skaftafell National Park and Jökulsárlón glacial lagoon. You'll enjoy panoramic views of Vatnajökull glacier and then head north to Lake Mývatn, Akureyri and Eyjafjörður. Your epic journey will end back in Reykjavik with its wealth of delightful hotels and restaurants. Additional activities can be added to the programme such as riding, sea-kayaking, river rafting, whale watching, glacial hiking, caving and sightseeing flights.

Golden Circle – This classic nature tour of south west Iceland includes the spectacular waterfalls at Gullfoss, Pingvellir National Park (now a UNESCO World Heritage site) and the bubbling geothermal area of Geysir.

The Blue Lagoon – Visit the geothermal field on the Reykjanes Peninsula to relax in its hot therapeutic waters and peaceful surroundings.

Black lava riding – An unforgettable half or full day in the saddle on a sturdy Icelandic pony.

South coast and waterfalls – Don't miss the dramatic Seljalandsfoss and Skógafoss waterfalls, walking to the snout of the Solheimajokull Glacier, black sand beaches and quaint villages.

Whales, puffins and sails – Tour the north coast on board a classic 19th century style schooner for whales and puffins at Lundey Island from June to mid-August.

Snaefellsness Peninsula – This national park offers vast lava fields, rugged coastline, pebble beaches, sea stacks, a profusion of sea birds and gorgeous fishing villages.

Myvatn and the north – Visit the majestic Godafoss Waterfalls, the Hverarönd solfataras (boiling sulphur mud pits) and Lake Myvatn – Europe's largest bird sanctuary.

There are a few areas in Greenland where the Inuit still use the dog sledge as their means of winter transportation and the most isolated village community, Ittoqqortoormiit (Scoresbysund) in the north east is one of them. Situated on the northern shore of the world's largest fjord, its inhabitants have a long tradition of hunting and travelling on the pack-ice as well as on land.

Ours is the very first effort to develop small scale tourism in co-operation with the people of Ittoqqortoormiit. These traditional dog sledging trips are made on the spectacular coast of Liverpool Land where the original Greenlandic way of hunting is still the basis of existence. Highlights include flights in Twin-Otter aircraft and helicopter, a few days in charming Ittoqqortoormiit village, wild arctic paradise and four days of camping and travelling with dog sledges.


Highlights of South Greenland | 10 days

Experience life in the pretty towns of Narsaq, which lies among luxuriant hills surrounded by glacier ice, and Qaqortoq, a charming mix of old colonial houses and young students. They provide a contrast to the delightful, quiet warmth of Igaliku village. You will also have time to visit the historic site of Brattahlid and take a boat cruise among the amazing blue icebergs of the Qooroq Ice Fjord.

Kulusuk, a village of about 375 inhabitants, is a small settlement which provides an excellent insight into life in Greenland today. Traditional hunting and fishing are still essential sources of income, though tourism is becoming increasingly important.

Combine your trip with Tasiilaq, just south of the Arctic Circle, the largest town in East Greenland. The 10-minute helicopter ride from Kulusuk is one of the most scenic expeditions imaginable, as you cross the ice-filled sea separating these two mountainous islands. Tasiilaq boasts long hours of daylight in the summer, and the splendour of the Northern Lights in winter.

Icebergs of West Greenland | 10 days

Our suggested itinerary for individuals incorporates boat trips among the spectacular grounded icebergs of the fjord at Illulissat and some easy walking in this third largest settlement in Greenland. A few days should be spent on Disko Island with time to visit the research station and walk among the basaltic lavas. After a boat trip to Port Victor you'll visit local viewpoints to see the glacier front and, hopefully, calving icebergs. One more challenging walk enables you to get up close to the inland ice.

Kap Tobin Arctic wildlife safari | 10 days

This is a truly unique trip based close to Scoresby Sund on Greenland's east coast. You'll stay in a privately owned home where the owner will oversee your trip and cook for you at night. Enjoy dog sledging and snowmobiling the local environs for fantastic views and hot springs. During your time with local hunters you will observe them checking their seal holes and be on the lookout for polar bear, seals and narwhales.

THE FAROE ISLANDS, midway between Norway and Iceland, poke out of the Atlantic Ocean like hardy little flowers. The landscape is one of steep cliffs rising from the open sea, narrow straits and natural harbours surrounded by small villages. This nation of 18 small islands, all but one of which are inhabited by less than 50,000 people and more than three million sea birds, is a dream for ornithologists and nature lovers.

The Faroese are a proud people who, due to their remote location, have been able to preserve their own culture, traditions and language with its roots in the Old Norse.

Your splendidly scenic self-drive tour starts in Vágar, heading by ferry to Mykines before the drive to Gjògv, famous for its long canal. En route, stop in Vestmanna for a boat trip to the bird cliffs or visit the beautiful small villages of Saksun and Tjørnuvik. Continue north to the little settlements of Eysturoy and Klaksvik, the second largest town of the Faroes. We recommend a stop in Leirvík to see the Viking ruins on the way. You'll have time to include villages on Vidoy, Kunoy and Bordoy before your final destination, Torshavn, the islands' capital. From here travel by ferry to the little island of Nólsoy, where time stands still, before ending your adventure back at Vagar.

ARCTIC AND FAR EAST RUSSIA

Much of Arctic Russia is tundra dotted with countless lakes and pools through which the vast north-flowing rivers wend their way to the Arctic Ocean. During the short, intense summer these areas are the nesting sites for numerous birds, including the red-breasted goose, Siberian crane and Ross's gull. Wild flowers brighten the ground and musk oxen, bears, reindeer, lynx, wolverine, wolves and foxes roam.

The Kamchatka Peninsula in the Russian Far East is home to the Itelmen, Eveni and Koryaks, some of whom live by their traditional ways of hunting, fishing, reindeer-herding and gathering wild plants. You will feel privileged to be gaining an insight into their very different way of life. Kamchatka is also the home of Russia's largest brown bear. The rivers teem with at least five species of spawning salmon and its rugged coastline accommodates thousands of seabirds as well as seals, sea lions and sea otters. In the valleys plants grow at an incredible rate during the summer due to the volcanically-warmed and minerally-enriched soil.

Dog sledging with the reindeer herders and native people | 16 days

Our route takes us over the pristine snow-covered mountain passes, high plateaux and valleys close to the volcano **Ichinskiy** in central **Kamchatka**. This area is the traditional home of some of the native peoples and we shall stay at an Eveni reindeer herder's winter camp and the wilderness home of a family of Koryak fishermen.

Nights are spent in huts or yurts (large, heated tents). In the village of Esso we will visit the museum, bathe in a hot pool, meet the local people and learn about their culture. If our visit coincides with the 'Beringia' dog sledge race we may be able to watch some of it and meet the competitors.

Bears, volcanoes, native people, reindeer herders, autumn colours

In order to experience the richness of the region's flora, fauna and geology, its scenery and autumn colours, we plan to visit as many habitats as possible including the central valley with the Kamchatka River, Tolbachik, Kzudach, Mutnovsky and Vachkazhets volcanoes, Kurilskoe Lake and the hot Khodukta River in the southern tundra. Kurilskoe Lake, part of a nature reserve, is one of the best places on the peninsula to see brown bears and Steller's sea eagles. Moving around by helicopter and truck we will watch bears feeding on berries and salmon spawning, swim in hot rivers, meet the locals in the settlement of Esso and stay overnight with the nomadic reindeer herders in their summer mountain camp.

Solovetski Islands and the White Sea | 12 days

Rugged snow-capped volcanoes, lava fields, geysers, fast

Situated in the White Sea, 150km south of the Arctic Circle, the Solovetski Islands were first settled by monks in the 1430s. The archipelago has six large and nearly 100 smaller islands which abound with lakes, wildflowers and nesting birds and, in summer, beluga whales gather to calve in the shallow waters.

On the largest island, surrounded by enormous stone walls, stands the legendary 16th Century Solovetski Monastery, which in the 20th Century was one of the most feared and infamous prison camps or 'gulags'. Now that the monks have returned, you can visit the beautiful cathedral, church, refectory and other buildings enclosed by the great 'kremlin' or fortification.

In some places, using small boats and wooden rakes, men still collect seaweed to be made into local products. Accommodation here is simple – family-owned comfortable small hotels with delicious food. It's an excellent place for walking in summer.

Several of our voyages are around Spitsbergen. Dutch for 'pointed mountains', this is an evocative name for the largest island of the Svalbard Archipelago in the High Arctic, 1,300km from the North Pole. It has a fascinating history of Arctic exploration and whaling. The scenery is dramatic - snowy peaks rise majestically through huge ice-caps, glaciers creep down valleys to the sea and sparkling ice walls enclose deep fjords. All this is surrounded by the glistening pack-ice as we walk along rocky shores. Since the banning of hunting in the 1970s, the populations of bears and walruses have increased dramatically and you are almost certain to see these magnificent creatures.

East Greenland is one of the least visited places in the High Arctic since permission to land on the coast of the National Park is granted to very few operators. Our voyages to East Greenland cover the beautiful fjord system of Scoresby Sund and the scenically spectacular south east coast, while West Greenland reveals its glorious shores from Ilulissat to Thule. Since they take place towards the end of the Arctic summer when the ice has receded, the autumn colours should brighten the tundra and there is an excellent possibility of seeing the Northern Lights.

We also sail to the **Scottish Islands**, **Russia**, the **Canadian Arctic** and the **High Arctic**.

Lichtenau is a nearly deserted village, and we try to visit Uunartoq to bathe in a large hot spring surrounded by icebergs. Our landings end with Vagar, Herjolfsnes (Ikigait) – the first landfall site for the Vikings, and Hvalsey's famous medieval Norse Cathedral.



Geese and waders collect near a lagoon a little way east of Kap Stewart. We will visit Ittoqqortoormiit before returning home.



Most of our voyages depart from Ushuaia at the southern tip of South America and cross the Drake Passage, spending several days visiting the South Shetland Islands and the Antarctic Peninsula. A few voyages embark in the South Shetland Islands (using a flight from Punta Arenas) thereby avoiding the infamous Drake Passage crossing. The peninsula is a spectacular chain of mountains and glaciers and is the richest part of Antarctica for wildlife. Its waters are sheltered by islands which makes for comfortable sailing and easy landings. Some of these voyages also visit South Georgia and the Falkland Islands.

South Georgia is a 100-mile long island of mountains and glaciers and fringed with vegetation that supports a great variety of wildlife, including the magnificent king penguin and wandering albatross, smaller birds such as the endemic pintail and pipit, as well as teaming colonies of fur seals. For those keen on history, many voyages visit the scene of Shackleton's epic crossing of the island.

The Falkland Islands are different again: An archipelago of large and small islands with an even more varied wildlife and relaxed lifestyle among the human inhabitants.

More adventurous voyages head for the Ross Sea, sometimes called 'The Far Side of Antarctica', on an icebreaker, to visit emperor penguin colonies and Scott's and Shackleton's huts. Because some of the vessels are comparatively small, early booking is recommended.

With his simple telegram 'Beg to inform you Fram proceeding Antarctic - Amundsen, the Norwegian explorer Roald Amundsen set the scene for the 'Race for the Pole'. It was a race that Amundsen was to win easily, largely due to his experience in the High Arctic and, especially, his reliance on dogs. Scott, his rival, is better known, even though he perished on the way home. Every year, dozens of Antarctic enthusiasts make the pilgrimage to Ross Island to visit Scott's huts and memorials.

This one-off expedition will travel to the Bay of Whales as we follow in the wake of Amundsen's ship, Fram. Very few expeditions have ever ventured to this sacred place, so far east in the Ross Sea. There are no relics or memorials, Amundsen's hut Framheim having long disappeared, a victim of the advancing Ross Ice Shelf.

Follow Sir Douglas Mawson's legendary heroics on this expedition cruise to Commonwealth Bay. East Antarctica. Mawson's Australian Antarctic Expedition 1911 - 1914 was notable for its scientific achievements and, sadly, its tragedies including the deaths of Ninnis and Mertz and Mawson's almost superhuman trek to safety.

Mawson's Hut at Cape Denison still stands defiant against the extreme weather. Cape Denison is one of the very few ice-free and readily accessible areas along the East Antarctic coast. However, when the Mertz Glacier tongue broke off in 2010 it blocked the annual movement of sea ice, isolating the area from shipping. At last we see opportunities to return and explore this majestic, remote coastline.

In addition to Mawson's Hut we hope to visit the research base Dumont D'Urville.
