Early spring, when the days lengthen rapidly, is a beautiful time of year in the Arctic and travelling by dog-sledge is to experience its true spirit. These expeditions in the mountains and high plateaux of Northern Norway have been organised and led by our Norwegian friends for many years. We can arrange short trips and extensions such as a visit by skidoo to the Sami (Lapp) people in their summer or

> winter camps, to **Summer Island** or the picturesque Lofoten Islands or a day visit to Tromsø for its Polar Museum and Northern Lights Planetarium.

How exhilarating it is to explore by dog sledge, standing on the runners whilst the dogs take the strain! Snow and weather conditions permitting, you will make daily trips through a beautiful snowscape. After a day on the trail, relax around a log fire while your hosts regale you from their fund of stories about life in the north. They are excellent cooks and their menus feature locally caught reindeer, elk and salmon. There's usually the chance to enjoy a sauna or hot tub too.

Winter in Northern Norway brings the opportunity of witnessing the extraordinary Northern Lights (Aurora Borealis) dancing in the sky. We recommend our tailor-made weekends for private groups of four or more. You'll fly to Bardufoss and we will take you to your simple but cosy accommodation for three nights. Try your hand at dog sledging or cross-country skiing, take a sauna or enjoy a hot tub under starry skies. We can see the Aurora Borealis around half of all clear weather nights during the winter, so your chances increase with the length of your stay.

Sledge along frozen rivers and lakes and explore the varied countryside around Kiruna. The expedition ends near Jukkasjarvi at the famous Ice Hotel. Made using ice from the Torne River, it's the largest igloo in the world and features ice sculptures, a cinema and the Absolut Ice Bar carved entirely from ice. You'll ride over glaciers, mountains and frozen fjords, and visit thrilling historical sites. There's a stillness and a light that is difficult to find elsewhere, and, if you are lucky, you might even glimpse a polar bear.

After six days we hope to make Isfjord Radio, where a comfortable bed awaits before the return to Longyearbyen.

We heat up the cabin with wood and fetch our drinking water from the melting glacier. The week includes several full day trips, planned daily according to the weather.

ICELAND is a world of natural splendour in the North Atlantic ocean, the long days and midnight sun of summer allowing visitors to make the most of this entrancing country. Winter brings with it the chance of seeing the other-worldly Aurora Borealis. A great way to really get to know this place of natural phenomena and legends from the 9th to early 11th centuries (known as the Saga Age), is touring by car. We have some wonderful self-drive itineraries or can arrange a driver/guide for you if you prefer.



Our classic **Golden Circle** day trip includes **Pingvellir National Park**, site of the first Viking parliament, as well as the fabulous **Gullfoss** waterfall and hot springs at **Geysir**.

Discover natural wonders such as the strange geothermal area of Krysuvik, Myvatn Lake, the Snaefellsness Peninsula and volcano, the beaches of South Iceland and the Blue Lagoon on the Reykjanes Peninsula – a unique geothermal spa only accessible by pre-arrangement. We also recommend spending time on Vestmanna Island (the Pompeii of the North).

Explore the rugged eastern part of Iceland whilst staying at a traditional farmhouse. Hike, saddle-up and try local food. For keen riders, we suggest a half or full day riding a sturdy Icelandic pony over black lava fields. You'd also enjoy an evening show at the Icelandic Horse Park, Fakasel.

Whale and puffin safaris are a must for Reykjavik and north Iceland. Other unbeatable highlights include a walk inside or snowmobiling on a glacier – or take to a helicopter for a bird's eye view of a glacier or an extinct volcano!



Not only is it worth extending your Iceland trip with a few days in Greenland, but it is a great destination for stand-alone holiday.

Travelling along the west coast by local steamer is a particular delight. The facilities may be simple but the incomparable scenery more than compensates. We've countless cruising itineraries which will combine with hotel stays in south or west Greenland.

Here, on the northern shore of the world's largest fjord, its inhabitants have a long tradition of hunting and travelling on the pack-ice as well as on land.

Join us for a traditional dog sledging trip on the spectacular coast of Liverpool Land. Highlights include flights in Twin-Otter aircraft and helicopter, a few days in Ittoqqortoormiit village, wild Arctic paradise and four days camping and travelling with dog sledges.

Icebergs of West Greenland | 10-13 days

See the majestic icebergs at the World Heritage Site of Ilulissat Ice Fjord and stay near the very active Eqi Glacier before moving on to Disko Island for two nights with local hikes in and around this former whaling station.

Ilulissat town, 380km north of the Polar Circle, is a fantastic gateway for exploring the Arctic. Take an iceberg safari, visit remote settlements or go 'flightseeing'.

One night 'glamping' at Camp Eqi will give you front row seats for the spectacle when the Eqi Glacier 'calves' right outside your window. It's a perfect base from which to hike and the huts all have private facilities and comfortable beds.

Approximately three hours by boat from **Ilulissat**, it is one of the oldest towns in Greenland with around 1,200 habitants – the local museum brims with stories from the old Thule culture.

For total immersion in **Arctic** nature and awesome scenery, stay not just close to but actually on the inland ice sheet. Setting out from and returning to **Kangerlussuaq**, you spend one night at **Camp Ice Cap**, a second at **Kangerlussuaq** and return to **Ilulissat** for the third. There are options to watch musk oxen

THE FAROE ISLANDS, midway between Norway and Iceland, poke out of the Atlantic Ocean like hardy little flowers. The landscape is one of steep cliffs rising from the open sea, narrow straits and natural harbours surrounded by small villages. This nation of 18 small islands, inhabited by less than 50,000 people and more than three million sea birds, is a dream for ornithologists and nature lovers.

The Faroese are a proud people who, due to their remote location, have been able to preserve their own culture, traditions and language with its roots in the Old Norse.

TOP TIP: The summers are short and hotels fill quickly so book early to avoid disappointment.



Faroe Islands deluxe self-drive | 8 days

Driving is the ideal way to explore this island nation. The infrastructure is generally of very high quality and distances between points of interest short, so you can see a lot without having to change hotels every night.

Visit key attractions such as the bird paradise of Mykines Island and Kirkjubøur village and stay overnight in the tiny but picturesque village of Gjogv. Visit the Saga Museum in Vestmanna and ferry hop between little islands in the north.

Torshavn, the Faroes' capital, has big city confidence and is worth a few days' stay. There are a growing number of excellent restaurants proudly showcasing their contemporary interpretation of traditional Faroese cuisine using local produce from both sea and mountain.

Atlantic nature – Vagar and Streymoy | 8 days

This tour combines the capital of the Faroes, Torshavn, with the island of Vagar. There's plenty of easy to moderate walking from both and we can pre-organise excursions to almost anywhere in the Faroes for you. Do take a day-trip to the island of Mykines, famous for its incredibly rich birdlife. For thrills you can go RIB-boating to the bird-cliffs along Vagar's coastline. Torshavn has a rich cultural life and several good museums.

Much of Arctic Russia is tundra dotted with countless lakes and pools through which the vast north-flowing rivers wend their way to the Arctic Ocean. During the short, intense summer these areas are the nesting sites for numerous birds, including the red-breasted goose, Siberian crane and Ross's gull. Wild flowers brighten the ground and musk oxen, bears, reindeer, lynx, wolverine, wolves and foxes roam.

The Kamchatka Peninsula in the Russian
Far East is home to the Itelmen, Eveni and
Koryaks, some of whom live by their
traditional ways of hunting, fishing,
reindeer-herding and gathering wild plants.
Kamchatka is also the home of Russia's
largest brown bear. The rivers teem with at
least five species of spawning salmon and
its rugged coastline accommodates
thousands of seabirds as well as seals, sea
lions and sea otters. In the valleys during
the summer plants grow at an incredible
rate due to the volcanically-warmed and
minerally-enriched soil.

Bears, volcanoes, native people, reindeer herders, autumn colours | 19 days

In order to experience the richness of the region's flora, fauna and geology, its scenery and autumn colours, we visit as many habitats as possible, including the central valley with the Kamchatka River, Tolbachik, Kzudach, Mutnovsky and Vachkazhets volcanoes, Kurilskoye Lake and the hot Khodukta River in the southern tundra. Kurilskoe Lake is one of the best places to see brown bears and Steller's sea eagles. Moving around by helicopter and truck we will watch bears feeding on berries and salmon spawning, swim in hot rivers, meet the locals in the settlement of Esso and overnight with the nomadic reindeer herders in their summer mountain camp.

Solovetski Islands and the White Sea | 12 days

The Solovetski Islands, 150km south of the Arctic Circle, were first settled by monks in the 1430s. This archipelago in the White Sea has six large and nearly 100 smaller islands which abound with lakes, wildflowers and nesting birds and, in summer, beluga whales gather to calve in the shallow waters.

On the largest island stands the legendary 16th Century Solovetski Monastery which, in the 20th Century, was one of the most feared and infamous prison camps or 'gulags'. Now that the monks have returned, you can visit the beautiful cathedral, church, refectory and other buildings enclosed by the great 'kremlin' or fortification.

In some places, using small boats and wooden rakes, men still collect seaweed to be made into local products. Accommodation here is simple – family-owned comfortable small hotels with delicious food. It's excellent territory for walking in summer.

Dog sledging with the reindeer herders and native people | 16 days

Our route takes us over pristine snow-covered mountain passes, high plateaux and valleys close to the volcano Ichinskiy in central Kamchatka. We shall stay at an Eveni reindeer herder's winter camp and the wilderness home of a family of Koryak fishermen.

Nights are spent in huts or yurts (large, heated tents). In the village of Esso we will visit the museum, bathe in a hot pool, meet the local people and learn about their culture. If our visit coincides with the 'Beringia' dog sledge race we might watch some of it and meet the competitors.

THE ARCTIC

Dutch for 'pointed mountains', Spitsbergen is the focus of several of our voyages. It's an evocative name for the largest island of the Svalbard Archipelago in the High Arctic, 1,300km from the North Pole. Snowy peaks rise majestically through huge ice-caps, glaciers creep down valleys to the sea and sparkling ice walls enclose deep fjords. All this is surrounded by the glistening pack-ice as we walk along rocky shores learning about Spitsbergen's fascinating history of Arctic exploration and whaling. Since hunting was banned in the 1970s, bear and walruses populations have increased dramatically and you are almost certain to see these magnificent creatures.

East Greenland is one of the least visited places in the High Arctic since permission to land on the coast of the National Park is only granted to a few operators. Our voyages there cover the beautiful fjord system of Scoresby Sund and the spectacular south east coast, while West Greenland reveals its glorious shores from Ilulissat to Thule. We visit towards the end of the Arctic summer when the ice has receded, the tundra is bright with autumn colours and there is an excellent chance of seeing the Northern Lights.

We also sail to the **Scottish Islands**, **Russia**, the **Canadian Arctic** and the **High Arctic**.

We continue into the Hinlopen Strait, where we will attempt a landing at Nordaustlandet. On to Phippsøya and, pack ice conditions permitting, to Laagøya, a low island where walrus congregate. We'll navigate the ice floes of Lomfjordshalvøya by Zodiacs and explore the bird cliffs and, in Freemansundet, plan to land on Barentsøya to visit an old trapper's hut. Then south to Edgeøya, ending in the spectacular Hornsund area. Depending on ice conditions early season voyages may only cover the west side.







VOYAGE Russia controls one of the greatest seaways in

the world, the Northern Sea Route, known to us as the Northeast Passage. Only a handful of expedition vessels have ever transited this route connecting the Atlantic and Pacific oceans.

It wasn't until 1878-1880 that Swedish explorer Adolf Erik Nordenskiold completed the first ever full transit. In 1914-15 Imperial Russian Navy icebreakers made the second transit to render the seaway navigable for strategic purposes. From the 1930s a number of polar research and weather stations were established along the route, and large convoys of Soviet ships (assisted by powerful icebreakers) used it to carry muchneeded supplies to Eastern Russia.

This all ended with the collapse of the Soviet Union in the early 1990s. However, recent changes in the sea ice have made the route accessible. Be among the first of the new generation to make this historic and fascinating voyage.



South Georgia is a 100-mile long mountainous island fringed with vegetation that supports a great variety of wildlife, including the magnificent king penguin and wandering albatross, smaller birds such as the endemic pintail and pipit, as well as teeming colonies of fur seal. For those keen on history, many voyages visit the scene of Shackleton's epic crossing of the island.


The Falkland Islands are different again: An archipelago of large and small islands with an even more varied wildlife.

More adventurous voyages head for the Ross Sea, sometimes called 'The Far Side of Antarctica', to visit emperor penguin colonies and Scott's and Shackleton's huts. Because some of the vessels are comparatively small, early booking is recommended.





In Shackleton's footsteps | 21 days

In this 100 year anniversary of Shackleton's Imperial Trans Antarctic Expedition (1914-1917) late summer will see us navigating through the Weddell Sea's shifting pack ice and vast tabular bergs, where Endurance was trapped and crushed. We hope to explore fossil-rich islands, historic huts and set foot on the continent before retracing Shackleton's heroic journey to save his men – first to Elephant Island, then on to South Georgia and a visit to the great explorer's grave. 

It was a race that Amundsen won easily, due to his experience in the High Arctic and his reliance on dogs. Scott, his rival, is better known, even though he perished on the way home. Every year, polar enthusiasts make the pilgrimage to Ross Island to visit Scott's huts and memorials

This one-off expedition will travel to the Bay of Whales as we follow in the wake of Amundsen's ship, Fram. Very few expeditions have ever ventured so far east in the Ross Sea.


