Three-masted wooden sailing schooner (the largest in Europe) with an ice strengthened hull
 Built in Finland in 1993 as a replica of the original Linden of the 1920s she has five twin cabins with private facilities, two single cabins with shared bathroom and a staff and crew of six to seven.
 Spacious outdoor viewing decks with 360° views and two lounges with plenty of windows, a library, good size sauna and an efficient ventilation system for drying your expedition gear.

Food sourced along the way from Danish and Norwegian artisanal and organic food producers. Svalbard trappers supply wild local reindeer and seal. Expect healthy and hearty meals with a creative twist including recreations of menus enjoyed by explorers, trappers and other heroes.



This expedition along frozen rivers and lakes in the varied countryside around Kiruna ends near Jukkasjarvi at the famous Ice Hotel. Made using ice from the Torne River, it features ice sculptures, a cinema and a bar carved entirely from ice. We can arrange a night or two's stay in this unique accommodation.

THE FAROE ISLANDS

Enchanting isles just waiting to be explored



THE FAROES poke sharply out of the Atlantic Ocean between Norway and Iceland. The landscape of these 18 remote islands is one of steep cliffs, narrow straits and natural harbours surrounded by small villages. Inhabited by less than 50,000 people and more than three million sea birds, the Faroe Islands are a nature lover's dream. The Faroese people are justly proud of having preserved their own culture, traditions and language rooted in the Old Norse.

Faroe Islands deluxe self-drive | 8 days

Driving is the perfect way to explore the islands. Roads are generally of high quality and distances between points of interest short, so you can see a lot without having to keep changing hotels. We recommend the bird paradise of Mykines Island, Kirkjubøur village and staying overnight in the tiny but picturesque village of Gjogv. Visit the Saga Museum in Vestmanna and ferry hop between little islands in the north.

Torshavn, the Faroes' capital, has big city confidence and is worth a few days' stay. There are a growing number of excellent restaurants using local produce to showcase their contemporary interpretation of traditional Faroese cuisine.


Icebergs of West Greenland | 10 days

Ilulissat town, 380km north of the **Polar Circle**, is a gateway for exploring the Arctic. Take an iceberg safari, visit remote settlements or go 'flightseeing'.

One night 'glamping' at **Camp Eqi** will give you front row seats for when the Eqi Glacier 'calves'. It's a perfect base from which to hike and the huts all have comfy beds and private facilities.

The Inuit people of the CANADIAN ARCTIC are an essential part of Canada's national and cultural identity.

Vast and sparsely populated, **Nunavut's** tundra-clad islands with their remote villages and archaeological sites are accessible only by plane or boat. Iconic narwhal and beluga whale thrive in its waters.

Baffin Island and Hudson Bay offer exceptional chances to get close to polar bear. Not only are the Northwest Territories home to vast numbers of caribou, but also wolves, wolverine, foxes, grizzly and black bears and a wide variety of birdlife.

Observe one of the largest caribou herds in North America as they roam the **Arctic Barrens**. The 250,000 strong **Qamanirjuaq** herd passes by **Arctic Haven** as they migrate between **Baker Lake** and the treeline. Grazing in small groups against the spectacular reds, greens and golds of autumn on the tundra, they may walk within metres of you. With the prospect of seeing the *Northern Lights* this truly is a trip of spectacle.





Three days of helicopter-supported adventures shuttle you to remote points to start each day's excursion. Trek and bike along the winding caribou trails etched into the tundra and fly fish for Arctic grayling and lake trout in clear cold streams.

We also set off in boats, on foot or in ATVs to visit archaeological sites, search for wildlife and explore the stunning tundra scenery. At day's end you'll sleep well after a sauna by the lake and a hearty feast.

Fly in over **Sirmilik National Park** and its stunning landscape of towering granite cliffs, glaciers and icebergs. Stay at our **Premium safari camp** on an Arctic beach with views of **Bylot Island** and access to the national park and the world-renowned floe edge of **Lancaster Sound**. Here, in the short intense summer, red-breasted geese, Siberian crane and Ross's gull nest. The ground is bright with wild flowers, and musk oxen, bears, reindeer, lynx, wolverine, wolves and foxes roam.

In the **Kamchatka Peninsula** in **RUSSIA'S FAR EAST** some of the Itelmen, Eveni and Koryaks still live by their traditional ways. Home to Russia's largest brown bear, its rivers teem with salmon and the rugged coastline supports thousands of seabirds as well as seals, sea lions and sea otters. In summer, plants in the valleys grow incredibly fast in the warm rich volcanic soil.



Heading down the coast, we make for Scoresbysund for a Zodiac cruise through icebergs past one of the many glacier fronts. After some final hiking at Ittoqqortoormiit we land at the airfield on Constable Pynt for the chartered plane to Reykjavik.

Between the high ice-cap of **North East Greenland** and the sea is a vegetation-rich strip of low country, that supports much wildlife. Some **Ittoqqortoormiit** people still make a living hunting polar bears, musk oxen, seals, whales and seabirds.

Crossing from **Spitsbergen** we keep watch for fin, humpback and minke whales and approach East Greenland, landing at **Myggebugten**. Moving south to **Scoresby Sund** we land near a glacier and encounter huge icebergs before disembarking in **Akureyri** in **North Iceland**.

Stalin encouraged economic development in this part of the Soviet Union but as the iron curtain was drawn and the Cold War escalated, it became forbidden territory and travel was strictly controlled. Dominated by the volcanoes of Kamchatka in the south, the fjords of the former Koryak region and the rich estuarine areas and tundra of Chukotka, the remote eastern coastline of Siberia has a huge diversity of habitats and wildlife. One of its most iconic endemic species is the critically endangered spoon-billed sandpiper. This expedition supports the work of research teams involved with this species and the monitoring of other seabirds and waders.

The Northern Sea Route | 30 days



Russia controls one of the greatest seaways in the world, the Northern Sea Route or Northeast Passage. Only a handful of expedition vessels have ever transited this seaway connecting the Atlantic and Pacific oceans but recent changes in the summer sea ice conditions now make this possible for a brief time each summer. In 2017, a double transit was successfully made and a couple of our intrepid clients undertook part of this journey. We're proud to be offering this again in 2020. It wasn't until 1878-1880 that Swedish explorer Adolf Erik Nordenskiold completed the first ever full transit. In 1914-15 Imperial Russian Navy icebreakers made the second transit to make the seaway navigable for strategic use. From the 1930s a number of polar research and weather stations were established along the route and large convoys of Soviet ships (assisted by powerful icebreakers) used it to carry much needed supplies to Eastern Russia before the collapse of the Soviet Union in the early 1990s.

The **Antarctic Peninsula** is a spectacular chain of mountains and glaciers supporting the richest wildlife in Antarctica. Islands shelter its waters, making for comfortable sailing and easy landings.

Most of our voyages depart from Ushuaia at the southern tip of South America and cross the Drake Passage, visiting the South Shetland Islands and the Antarctic Peninsula. A few voyages embark in the South Shetland Islands (using a flight from Punta Arenas) to avoid the Drake Passage crossing. Some voyages take in South Georgia and the Falkland Islands. In **South Georgia** you'll find the magnificent king penguin and wandering albatross, smaller birds such as pintail and pipit, and teeming colonies of fur seal. Polar historians are spoilt for choice with many voyages visiting scenes of heroic polar achievements. Different again, the **Falkland Islands** support an incredibly varied wildlife.

More adventurous voyages head for the **Ross** Sea to visit emperor penguin colonies and Scott's and Shackleton's huts. Because some of the vessels are comparatively small we recommend booking early.




